Monday

\$800/Class – Online through Zoom/SLC Pleasantville Onsite

10:00-11:00 – Greatest Inventions #1184 - This course will explore the inventors and the inventions that have shaped the world we live in. Why are they important and can we live without them? Skill Development - Reading and reading comprehension, writing, research techniques, following step by step directions, verbal communication, critical thinking, team membership.

11:00-12:00 – Art & Journaling #1099 - This course will explore journaling as a form of self-expression. Individuals will explore their interests, goals, skills, strengths and weaknesses. We will use art to enhance and explore these topics. Skill Development - Reading, writing, drawing, creative/self-expression, critical thinking, verbal communication, research techniques, self-advocacy, cultural awareness.

12:30-1:30 Topics in Review #1159 - The objective of this class is to encourage students to discuss issues which have the greatest importance to them. Topics can include current events, previous class discussion or personal interests. Skill Development - Verbal communication, writing, critical thinking, research techniques, teamwork.

1:30-2:30 World Events, What's Happening Now #1071 - The world is constantly changing around us. This course will explore these changes and how they influence us as individuals. Students will research world events using different sources for information such as newspaper, TV, internet, and social media. Skill Development- Reading and reading comprehension, writing, research techniques, verbal communication, organization, enhanced local, national and world view.

Tuesday

10:00-11:00 – A Blast from the Past #1013 - Each decade has its own individual identity. From the Great Depression, to the hippy 60's, the disco 70's then on towards the new millennium and our first African American president, we will discover what changes have occurred by examining the music, family life, culture and film of each decade. Skill Development -Reading and reading comprehension, research techniques, verbal communication, critical thinking, enhanced world view.

11:00-12:00 – Changes to Our Environment #1185 - This course will focus on the environment and the changes it has caused to everyday life. Learn about how these changes impact us and what we can do to help. Skill Development - Reading and reading comprehension, enhanced world view, critical thinking, research techniques.

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1:30-2:30 - Astronomy #1096 - Space is a vast and unknown world full of mysterious galaxies, faraway planets, moons, stars and immense darkness. Our students will embark on a journey of exploration to learn about our solar system, the origins of the US space program and the technological advancements which will take us to the moon and beyond. Skill Development - Reading and reading comprehension, enhanced world view, critical thinking, research techniques.

Wednesday

10:00-11:00 - History and Culture of the Hudson Valley #1123 - This course will explore the Hudson Valley. Students will explore the history, religion, culture, art and industry, as well as famous figures from the area and their contributions to the history of the region. Skill Development- Research techniques, culture and social awareness, history, team membership, verbal communication, self-expression, public speaking, oral interpretation.

11:00-12:00 - Poetry #1093 - This class will focus on developing student creativity through writing and discussion. We will cover various poetry formats, read and discuss famous poets and then create our own poems. Skill Development - Reading, writing, critical thinking, creative/self-expression, verbal communication.



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1:30-2:30 – Marvel vs. DC #1186 - Students will explore the characters, storylines and technology of the Marvel and DC universe. Students will explore the similarities and differences in the styles of Stan Lee and Malcolm Wheeler-Nicholson. Skill Development - Reading and reading comprehension, writing, critical thinking, research techniques, group dynamics, teamwork.

Thursday

10:00-11:00 – Library Treasures #1187 - This course will explore articles, short stories or excerpts from daily news. Students will focus on reading, comprehension, and writing. Students will be organizing ideas into group research projects. 10:00-11:00 – Animal Planet #1144 - The class will step into the minds of famous animal scientists, explore zoos from around the world, and discover a day in the life of various working animals. Skill Development- Reading and reading comprehension, enhanced world view, critical thinking, research techniques.

11:00-12:00 – Children's Literature for College Students # 1083 - This course will explore different genres in children's literature such as fairy tales, fantasy and poetry. Students will discuss and write how literature plays a role in the lives of children. Skill Development - Reading and reading comprehension, writing, critical thinking, vocabulary, self-confidence, verbal communication.
